Career Opportunities for Youth, Training and Work Experience

Career Opportunities for Youth, Training and Work Experience (COYOTE) is a program for youth of Indigenous Heritage, newcomer youth or youth experiencing barriers (age 18-29) that is approached from two perspectives: traditional and mainstream education. At Toronto Council Fire Native Cultural Centre, we work in partnership with participants to build a 'holistic' or 'wrap around' approach. Throughout the program, everyone is encouraged to use Council Fire's free lunch program and activities at the Gathering Place.

Our community partner, Working Skills Centre (WSC) provides certificate training as part of its licensed career college, Academy of Computer & Employment Skills. Specifically this 32-week training enhances employability in mainstream medical facilities, at the same time developing competencies integrating traditional and mainstream healing practices. Components include:

- Traditional explorations to enhance spirit and develop confidence and security
- Microsoft Office (certifications in Word and/or Excel)
- Medical Terminology, Medical Office Procedures, and an introduction to Medical Transcription
- Certificate in Electronic Medical Records
- and Traditional Healing

The program includes computer training, traditional learning, special ceremonies, practical work experience, a work placement with an employer, job search assistance and job retention support. A completion award, a notebook computer, will be given to each graduate.

The first group of 15 participants will start their training on October 27th (Monday). Assessments are on-going until that time. Information Sessions are held every Tuesday and Thursday at Toronto Council Fire from 1:30-3:30.
